

Saying Goodbye

Earlier this year, I attended a patients home to care for a gentleman overnight, who

was coming to the end of his life. When I arrived there, I met his family, namely his daughter and their pet dog. The gentleman had adopted the dog from a rescue centre just prior to lockdown, following the death of his wife. He and the dog had become close companions and when his daughter also moved in to stay with and care for her Dad, they became a whole family.

In the early part of night, I sat with his daughter by the gentlemans' bedside. The dog, who was quite elderly, needed to be carried upstairs to join us. He also needed to be lifted up onto the bed to lie with his Dad, but would get down and lie on the floor from time to time.

The gentleman died peacefully in the early hours of the morning, with his daughter holding his hand and comforting him.

After he had died, she went downstairs with the dog, while I carried out last offices and verified that the death had occurred.

As I was walking down the stairs, it crossed my mind that maybe I should suggest that the dog be helped to see his Dad one last time, so he could understand that he had died and not simply abandoned him. I hesitated a little, thinking that maybe his daughter would think I was a bit odd. When I got downstairs, I explained to his daughter what I was thinking, she was thinking and feeling the same!

She carried the dog back upstairs and lifted him onto the bed so he could know his Dad had gone and say a last goodbye.

Life doesn't stop for Lydia

Lydia shares her story of dealing with Lymphoedema and not letting it get in her way.

"I saw over 11 doctors and received 2 scans and still no luck. Then I came across Hospice at Home. They have been amazing they have always supported me and have been so helpful when I have been concerned about my leg regarding infections."

Leading up to her wedding, Lymphoedema Lead Susie Bulman set to work making sure that Lydia had a sock that would support her on her special day.

"Lydia has never let her lymphoedema diagnosis slow her down. She wears compression daily to allow her to continue completing the activities she loves. When I heard she was getting married it was a pleasure to be able to source her "something blue" (stocking) for her big day."

Lydia added "To be honest I forgot I had it on. Throughout the day it was so comfortable and as I was wearing trainers it was perfect. I didn't need to adjust it and I had a lymphatic massage before it went on. I only stopped to rest it once and that was at 9pm and I had the stocking on since 7am that morning. I also danced till midnight."

Lydia's message to other Lymphoedema patients is:

"Don't be ashamed of your Lymphoedema. Embrace it . Find what works for you. For me its swimming twice a week. I also found that when I was relaxed and had my legs raised higher than my heart it went down. One aspiration I have is to keep my leg the same dimensions throughout exercise and Manual Lymphatic Drainage (MLD). So that I can live an active normal life." We love Lydia's positive attitude to her diagnosis and we are sure she will achieve her aspiration! Congratulations on your wedding!

If you are a solicitor and would like to take part in this campaign please ring the Fundraising Office 01228 475025.

Gov.uk recommends updating your will every 5 years or at major life changes such as:

- Getting separated or divorced
- 2. Getting married (this cancels any will you made before)
- 3. Having a child
- 4. Moving house
- 5. If the executor named in the will dies

The average cost when making a single basic Will is over £220.

A *Make a Will* donation of £170 to Hospice at Home, for example, could go towards funding a Health Care Assistant providing a full night of care (this usually costs £169), allowing families and carers to have a good night sleep knowing that their loved one is being cared for. While you are making or amending your Will this October, have you considered leaving a **legacy**?

What is a Legacy?

A legacy is a term used to refer to a gift in a Will. This could be to an specific individual, group or charity that is extra important to the person making the Will. This could be anything within their estate. Leaving a legacy gift to Hospice at Home allows us to plan for the future, improve our clinical service and reach out to more people that could benefit from our aim of providing free care and support to patients and families in the home.
