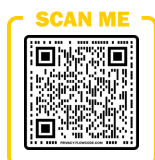

Step by step

Last year, thanks to our incredible supporters, patients and families across our community received 12,300 hours of care from Hospice at Home Carlisle and North Lakeland, free of charge. It is only with your ongoing support that we can continue to deliver this. By committing to an affordable gift every month, you will make a huge difference to a patient or family facing an end of life journey, joining them every step of the way.

For each step, we ask you donate £12.30 per month. Your monthly gift quickly adds up to significant support, and it will go even further if you Gift Aid your donation:

 **12 steps a year** would provide 2 periods of respite care

 **36 steps a year** would fund 17 hours of nursing care

 **72 steps a year** would enable 3 full nights of respite care

[NB these examples demonstrate the level of impact that your support could give if your donation includes gift aid, and is based upon average costs of service delivery]

The journey of care: a pathway of support

No two end-of-life journeys are the same. Each patient and carer faces their own unique challenges, emotions and needs. That's why we offer a wide range of services - designed to provide comfort, dignity, and support at every stage.

From the first referral to ongoing bereavement care, our team is here to walk alongside you. Our services can be accessed individually or combined to create a personalised pathway of care that fits your life, offering the right care at the right time.

Thanks to a generous grant from Hospice UK and the Masonic Charity Foundation, patients with progressive neurological conditions can now access nurse-led respite care. This new service is designed to provide expert care at home, giving families much-needed rest while ensuring patients receive expert support.

Alan's story

Take Alan's story, for example, diagnosed with Progressive Supranuclear Palsy (PSP), a rare condition affecting movement, speech, and swallowing. Alan became increasingly dependent on his wife. As his condition progressed, she faced exhaustion and was unable to leave his side due to the complexity of his care.

Thanks to this funding, a Hospice at Home Carlisle and North Lakeland nurse was able to take over medication administration, allowing Alan's wife to reconnect with family and recharge. Over time, both Alan and his wife built trust with our team and expressed a wish to continue receiving support as his condition changes.

Grief can be lonely. By attending our bereavement together group, connections and friendships have been made.

“ I came to the first Bereavement Group in February 2024 when it first started and attended 8 group meetings.

Being with others experiencing grief, where I could just be me and could express myself without the fear of upsetting others was so valuable. I felt I had the freedom of expression in the group. There were four great benefits for me attending the group:

- Making new friends
- Group support
- The group taught me that I can just be myself
- Professional support

The group is still ongoing, which is testament in itself and shows the enormous benefit for people. It was a brilliant idea to set the group up.

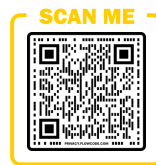

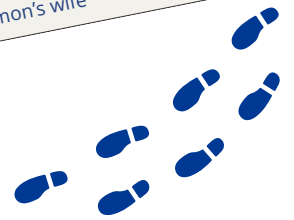

Each light shines in honour of a loved one, celebrating their life and cherished memories.

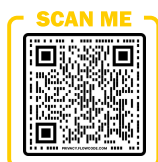
As part of your Light up a Life tribute:

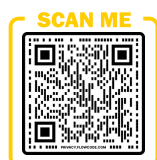
